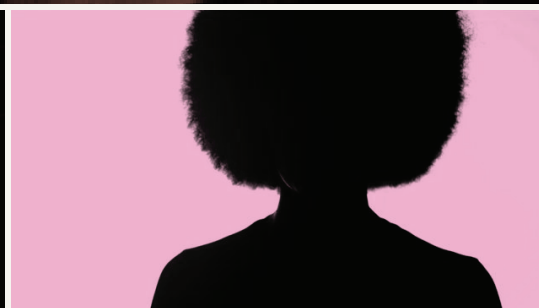
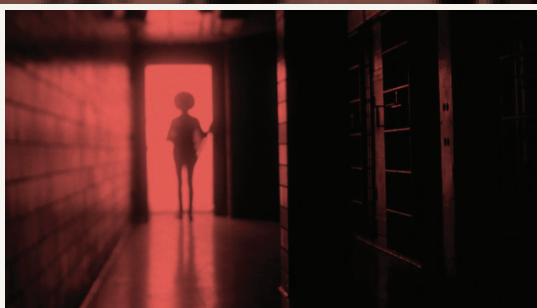
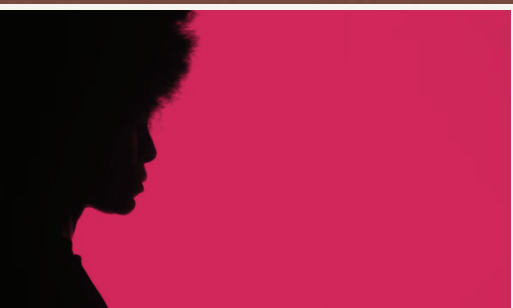

Director Shola Lynch's gripping documentary offers a firsthand account of the events that thrust Angela Davis into the national spotlight in the early 1970s. From a newly-appointed philosophy professor to a fugitive on the FBI's Ten Most Wanted List, Davis speaks openly about the fight to keep her job and her freedom after joining the Community Party, protesting with the Black Panthers, and becoming a spokesperson for the prison reform movement.
